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Program Accomplishments

Public Access of Indianapolis, Inc. (PAI) is a member-driven, volunteer organization. The mission of Public Access of Indianapolis is twofold. The first aspect of the mission is to provide citizens with the tools of the mass media, as well as education in the use of those tools. The second aspect is to provide local nonprofit organizations and community groups with economical and effective products of mass media. PAI has sought to encompass both aspects of our mission by training volunteers in the use of video equipment, and coordinating those volunteer's efforts with local non-profits and community groups. PAI's volunteer work was primarily done for small, local nonprofit organizations who have a need to promote their programs and ideas, but don't have the resources to hire professional production houses or purchase their own equipment:

PAI Vice President, Nick Hess has continued to work on a long-term project with the local Amnesty International chapter on the Death Penalty. In 2000, Nick videotaped interviews and speeches of the following local leaders:

Using videographer hourly rates of \$75 per hour, PAI provided approximately \$3000 hours of free video production services to area non-profits in year 2000.

In keeping with its mission of providing the tools of mass media, Public Access of Indianapolis is an applicant for a 100 watt low-power fm license. This effort has included coalition-building, and location research, and transmitter location documentation. PAI is carefully watching the changing national regulatory climate. PAI also participated in public hearings regarding the Marion County Cable Franchise Board and the addition of two new cable service providers. PAI urged the inclusion of community-friendly clauses, including channel capacity to be set aside for non-commercial, community media.
